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1954 Aston Martin Db3 Antenna

The Aston Martin DB3 and later DB3S were sports racing cars built in the 1950s. Although they used some DB2 parts, they were quite different, being designed especially for racing. The original modifications were done by ex-Auto Union engineer, Eberan von Eberhorst, though others handled the later DB3S work.

Aston Martin built ten DB3's from 1951-1953. DB3/8 is thought to be one of seven DB3's left in existence, and the only DB3 left with all of its original body including the original grill. During the restoration particular attention was paid to preserving as much of the original parts as possible including rebuilding and fitting the original engine.

For the 1954 racing season, Aston Martin designed two new cars with fixedhead coupe bodies (DB3S/6 and DB3S/7) as it was believed that these would be even more aerodynamic and

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therefore faster. After a reasonable debut at Silverstone where they finished 7th and 12th overall, disaster struck at Le Mans where both cars were sensitive to ...

Launched in October 1953, the Aston Martin DB 2/4 marked a step change for Aston Martin as they began to tap into the untouched market of 'sports enthusiasts with family'. Early 1954 DB 2/4 were capable of a reported top speed of 190 km/h, with 0 - 100 in 11 seconds which at the time held the title of 'fastest car built in Britain'.

1954 Aston Martin DB2/4 History T he Aston Martin DB2 was introduced to the public at the New York Motor Show. This was not the vehicle's first appearance as it had been raced at the grueling 24 Hours of LeMans where one of the drivers, Pierre Marechal, had been involved in a fatal accident.

As a result, Aston Martin finished third in the World Sportscar Championship (WSC). In 1954, the troublesome inboard-mounted rear brakes inherited from the DB3 were transferred to the hubs, the only major change made to the chassis during the car's lifetime.

In Pebble Beach in 2009, Gooding sold the sister car, another 1954 Aston Martin DB2/4 Bertone Spider, for \$1,045,000. In 2011, this same car again sold at RM Auctions for just shy of
